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Let's Get It Right

An article in the last issue of the Capital Times did not accurately reflect the campus's compliance with the American with Disabilities Act.

A few years ago there was an ADA study done, engineering students went around campus with tape measures to see what complied and what needed renovation.

The results of the study were sent to the Vice President at University Park. Penn State University, as a whole, then requested funds from the State to perform the necessary renovations. Penn State Harrisburg's request was for \$3.2 million to make changes in order to comply with ADA regulations.

Penn State adopted the philosophy that they would accommodate wherever necessary. With the renovations to the CRAGS building, it is

now in compliance with ADA. The EAB building has restrooms that are accessible to disabled people.

A number of other things have been done:

- SGA President
 Duane Brooks wrote a
 letter to University
 Park about Renee
 Reedy's problems with
 access to the restrooms
 in the Olmsted building. As a result, the
 University Access
 Committee has acted
 on his letter.
- The committee has a pool of funds to be used for critical problems. A portion of those funds has been allocated to PSH for renovations of the men's and women's restrooms on the first floor of the Olmsted Building. Those bathrooms will be gutted and made in compliance with ADA.
- The third floor women's restroom will be made into two sepa-

rate restrooms, one single stall for men and one single stall for women. All restroom construction should be complete by the end of this summer.

- The design of the "library of the future" will meet every ADA requirement.
- The braille signage in the men's and women's restrooms and the stairtowers is in compliance with ADA regulations.
- There is a lift in the auditorium which enables wheelchair-users to get on the stage.
- There is an elevator in the EAB building, the CUB and the Olmsted building to comply with ADA regulations for two story buildings.
