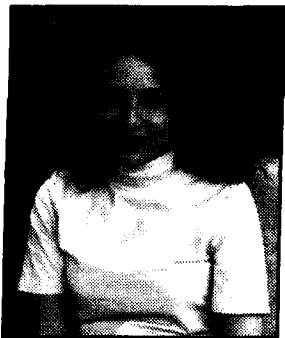

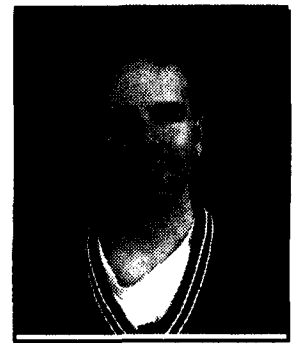
Cheyanne Morris
