down the field and Darius Johnson caught a touchdown pass from Paul Uhl. This time the Hoppers made the extra point to make it 13-0.


Before halftime, the Wildcats took the ball to the Hoppers' five-yard line but were unable to score despite a near spectacular catch by John Johnson.
