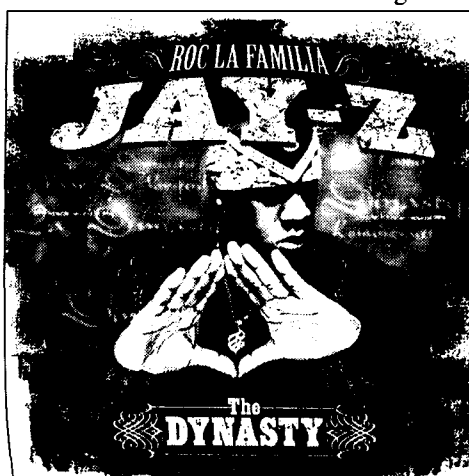
Ah, B*Witched. I lovingly refer to these four Irish lasses as "my girls." Why? I don't know. Maybe it's because I wish
