ness services, admits that inclement weather will most likely delay the new dorm's opening until the summer of 2002, rather than the optimistic completion date of January next year.

Dankanich said the university is working hard to remain under the budget of \$14.5 million for the housing project. The plan is to spend \$11.5 million on construction and an additional \$3 million for furniture, permits, cable, phone lines, etc.

The original plan called for an occupancy level of 283 residents in the structure now under construction. Since there are 356 students currently living in Meade Heights, that occupancy level created an immediate shortfall in available housing. According to Coleman, recent architectural design changes provide room for 356 students.

Dankanich reports that, as of right now, there are no plans for special rooms or living facilities for students with families. JoAnn Coleman, director of housing and food services, says there is still a possibility that these may be made available when phase two of construction begins later this year.
