I hope that this serves as a warning to future SGA administrations (the president of SGA serves as the co-chair of the Student Activity Fund Committee)—The Capital Times is the student voice and showcase for student talent at PSH and serves as a visual selling point to the community that hires our graduates, as well as being a showpiece to prospective students. Don't let this paper fall prey to political maneuvering and personal agendas. What we produce and how we represent ourselves to national advertisers is a direct reflection on the quality of output from this university.

Never forget that the press is a huge part of what keeps big business and politicians honest and accountable, thereby preventing special interests, big money, and unscrupulous individuals from steam-rolling the common people.

Before we "sign off," we want to congratulate our staff, advisors and supporters for another successful year and wish Stacy DeAngelo and the other members of the "rat pack" every success in taking over the reins of this publication.
