Applications are now available for the Alpha Sigma Lambda Adult Education Foundation scholarship awards. ASL will award seven \$1000 scholarships nationally to adult students for the academic year 2003-2004.

Students do not have to be ASL members to apply, but must meet the application eligibility of being 22 or older, matriculated in an associate or bachelor's degree program, and have completed 30 graded semester hours as of the fall semester with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.4.
