## **Campus radio station** to be on air by semester's end

With a full staff, WPSH hopes to broadcast between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.


"As far as I know, the frequency boundaries are the parking lots," said Pudlowski. "This is due to the fact that there are several large buildings blocking Olmsted's frequency."
