PSH experience into job ready marketability.

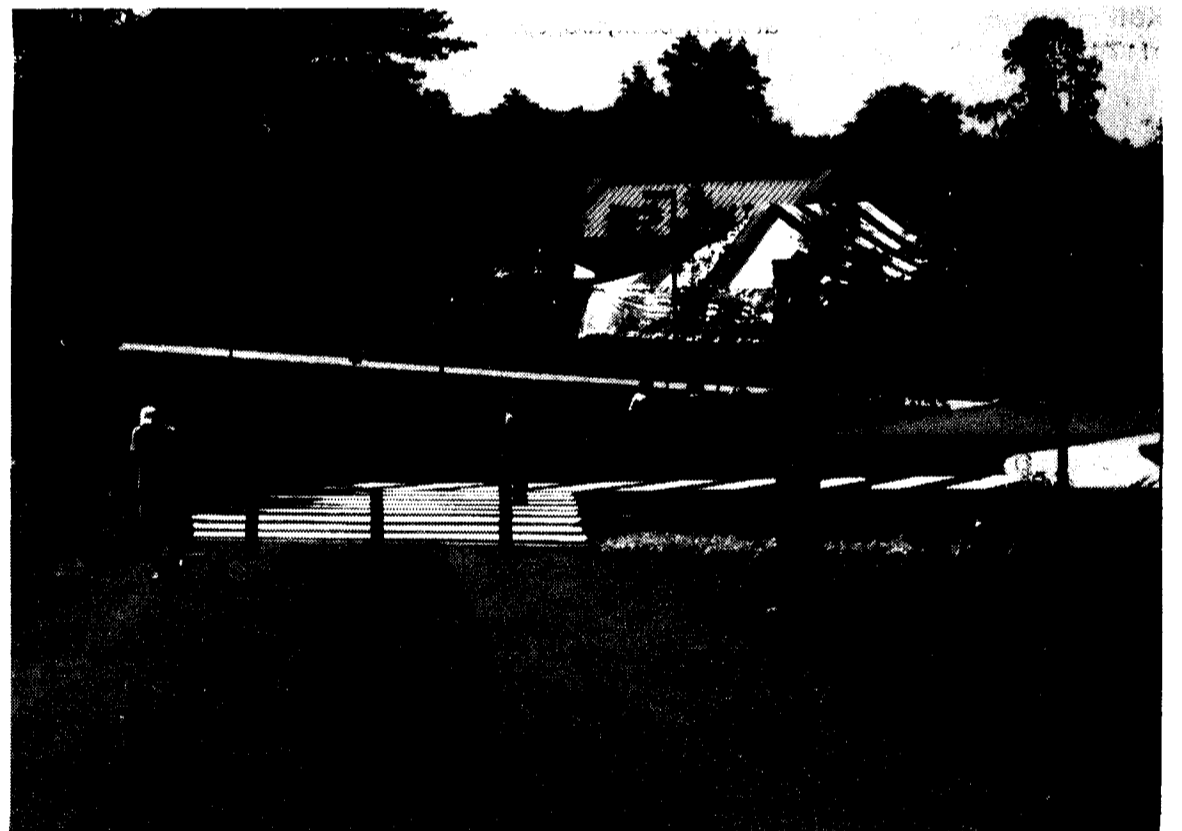
