and to get to the next room you have to solve a puzzle. You almost work into a panic trying to get out. There are only four rooms, but trust us four rooms are enough. After finishing the house you head straight into the Terror Visions in 3-D. This is the first 3-D attraction that made me really jumpy. Entirely clown themed, the rooms felt like something out of a
