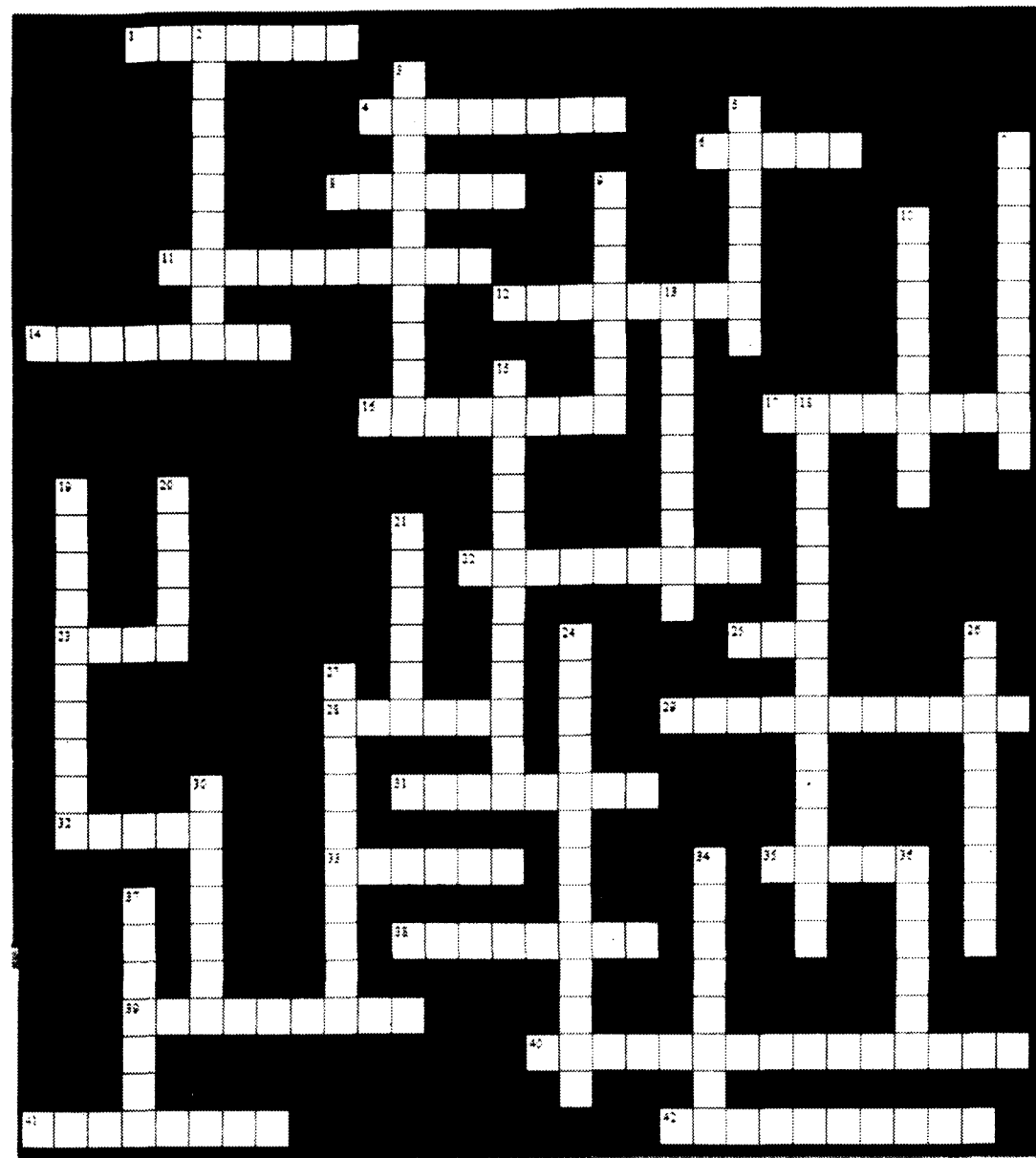

Safeguard Your Passwords
According to Penn State policy AD20, any individual who uses University computer and network resources at all University locations, must not transmit, share, or divulge passwords to others. Policy information is at <http://guru.sp.psu.edu/policies/AD20.html>. IIT's Technology Today newsletter will be providing some guidance on how to safeguard a password in an upcoming issue. At least one action you can take now to ensure your password is not transmitted to, shared with, or divulged to others is not to display your password on a sheet of paper or post-it note attached to your monitor or somewhere else in your office.

The upper level CUB doors that lead out to the Swatara parking lot will be locked at all times beginning in January. This is a liability and safety issue and the doors can no longer be unlocked for groups using the upstairs rooms. All CUB

entrance/egress (with the exception of emergencies) must occur at the main lobby doors. All doors to the Capital Union Building are currently alarmed and will continue to be so.
