ARREM.—The New Testament; Notes, Pictorial Illustrations, and References. Vol. I. The Four Gospels; With a Chronological History. By Israel P. Warren. 8vo., pp. 386. Boston: American Tract Society.

An admirably contrived apparatus for facilitating the study of the Scriptures. Its exterior is unusually attractive and elegant, the typography, press work, and tinted paper being among the finest specimens of the art. It is preceded by a chronological harmony of the Gospels, which closely follows Dr. Robinson, each section being numbered. The text itself is divided into corresponding sections, numbered in the same manner. Thus, the opening of Matthew's Gospel is § 6, while the opening of Luke is § 1.

This is a very simple, unelaborate, and yet effective plea for the practice, and argument for the practicability, of extempore preaching. Its chief interest and value lie in its being a transcript of the writer's own experience in the effort to train himself to this kind of preaching.
