A BOOK FOR THE AGED. NEARING HOME. Comforts and Counsels for the Aged. Compiled for the Presbyterian Board of Publication. Philadelphia: Presbyterian Board, 821 Chestnut Street, 5m. 8vo., pp. 464.

A volume of extracts in prose and poetry well suited to the later period of life. The selections of poetry are more numerous, varied and meritorious than the prose. But the whole contents are more solid and good, than entertaining and spicy. There is no such title as a Happy Old Age to any of the pieces. Aged people we think are the very ones, who need and who would value the element of vivacity in any special effort for their profit.

PIIONEER EXERTIONS; OR, THE GIFT OF POWER RECEIVED BY FAITH FROM THE TESTIMONY OF EIGHTY LIVING MINISTERS OF VARIOUS DENOMINATIONS. By the author of "Way of Holiness." Four Years in the Old World, etc. Introduction by Bishop James, New York: W. C. Palmer, Jr., 12mo., pp. 368.

This is a book whose title is almost without meaning its purpose being to exhibit the experience of individuals who regard themselves as having attained sanctification. The attempt to love it anything but a collection of Methodist Love Feast experiences is well nigh a failure. For of the eighty-odd testimonies introduced, at least seven are from that denomination.

KRUMMACHER, David, the King of Israel, a Poem. Drawn from Bible History and the Book of Psalms. By Frederic Whittier. Krummacker, D.D., author of "Elijah the Prophet," etc. Translated under the Express Sanction of the author, by Rev. M. G. Easton, M. A. 12mo., pp. 518. New York: Harper & Brothers, Philadelphia: J. B. Lippincott.

The peculiar genius, style and piety of Krummacher give him an exceptional and interesting position in his own country and in theological circles generally. Every class of Christian minds is reached, stimulated, enlightened and warmed by his devotional works.

Many of the choicest and most profitable spiritual lyrics, old and new, are included in this handsome volume. As poetry they answer the demands of a correct taste, and as aids to Christian progress they will be found of the highest value.

This is a lively story of a family who found a new home in Texas, after disasters in an older part of country. Both scenes and characters are fresh and novel and managed with considerable skill.

The first story in this volume, happily illustrates the victorious power of true piety in the lowliest position, and against the coarsest and most unsympathizing current of popular feeling. Several other stories make up the volume.
