The Public Debt.—By a comparison of the last statement issued, with that of June, it is shown that the debt bearing coin interest has increased \$67,543,958; the debt bearing currency interest has decreased \$118,512,550; the matured debt, not presented for payment, shows an increase of \$1,288,900. The total debt has decreased \$10,164,880. The amount of coin in the Treasury has decreased \$6,818,641. The currency has increased \$13,288,939.93. 762, while the total debt, less the cash in the Treasury, shows an increase of \$13,288,939.93.
