leld at Niagara Falls, the following business was transacted: Rev. J. W. Marcussohn was received Five vols. of Lange. from the Presbytery of Cincinnati, and Rev. Philander Griffin from the Presbytery of Buffalo. Rev. F. A. Chase was dismissed to the Presbytery of Cedar Rapids. A joint request of Rev. C. R. Burdick and the First church of Porter for a dissolution of the pastoral relation, was presented and granted by Presbytery. Mr. Burdick is called to the flourishing church at Marquette, Mich. Elder Willard Weld, of the First church, Lockport, was appointed a Commissioner to Auburn Seminary for three years.

No special religious interest was reported from any of the churches, but a general state of religious declension.

The following Commissioners were appointed for the next General Assembly: Rev. E. P. Marvin, Principal; and Rev. L. B. Rogers, alternate, Lay: Elder Wm. F. Evans, Principal, and Elder William Weld, alternate.

The following action was taken upon the Reunion with the utmost unanimity?

First, The Joint Committee's Plan of Union, overtured by the General Assembly, was cordially approved. Then in order to facilitate, and, if possible, insure this consummation so devoutly to be wished, at an early day, the following resolution was offered:

Resolved, That while we approve the union of the two branches of our Church on the above named basis, we also give our unanimous consent to the consummation of the union upon the basis of "the Standards pure and simple," without exposition or explanation, if the Assemblies shall think fit so to do.
