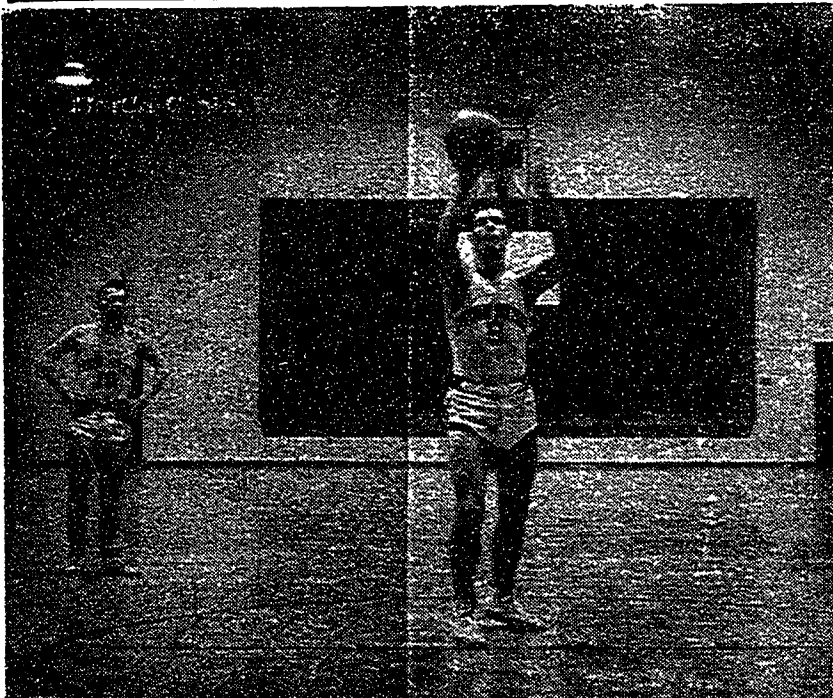

The Behrend Bowlers won a three game series with the Alliance College Bowlers on January 9. Sid Wallace was hitting the pins for the highest of the series—483.

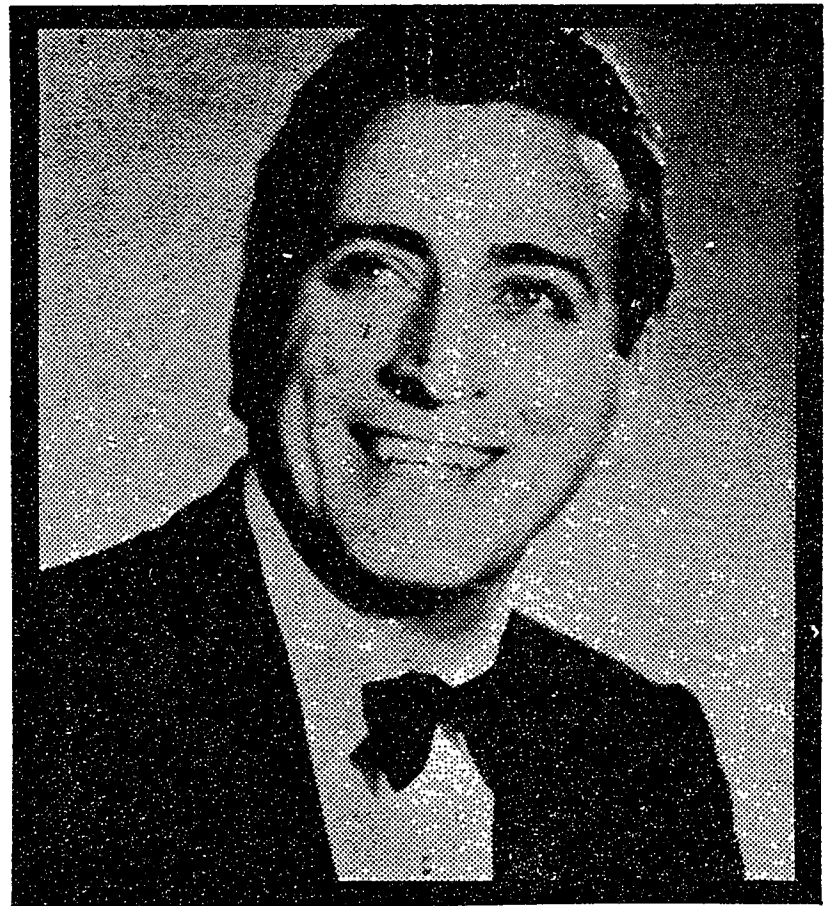
