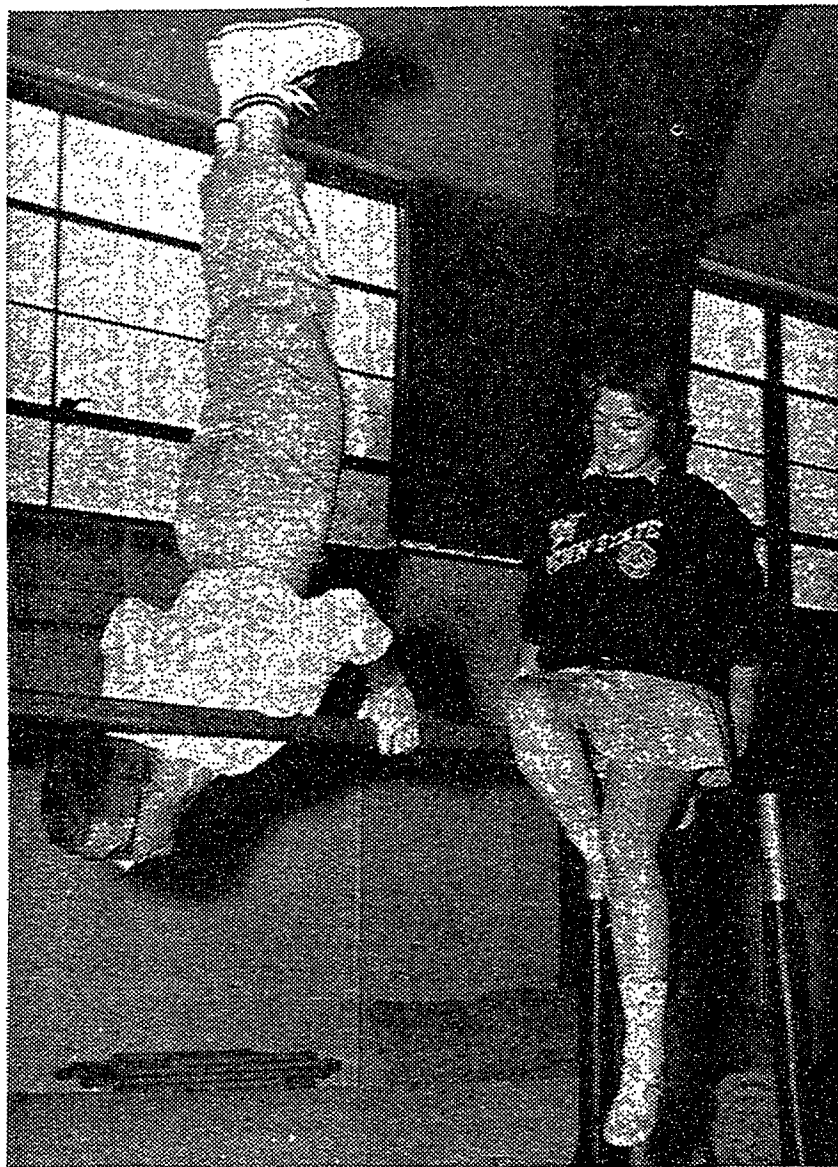

Meet Your Faculty

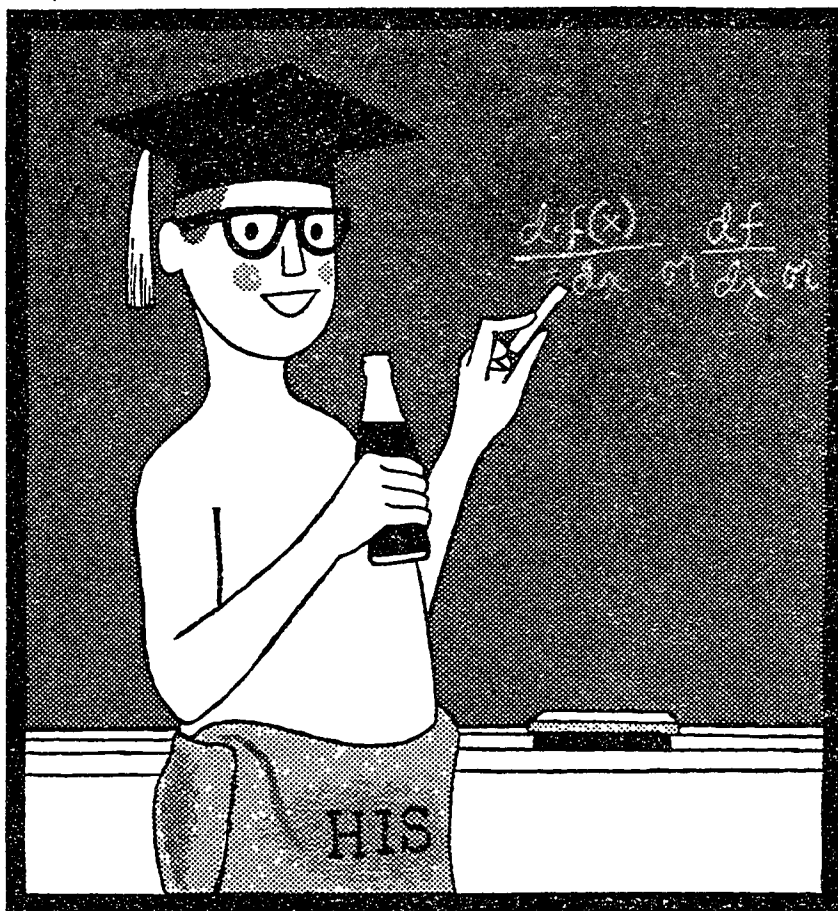
