On March 7 the Drafting and Design Technology students began their interviews for jobs after their graduation in June. On March 9 Electrical Technology students started their interviews along with the DDT's.

The interviews have been conducted by representatives of Babcock and Wilson, I.B.M., and Copes Vulcan. In April, Federal Aviation Agency and Rocketdyne will finish the interviews.

Nearly 100% of the boys here at Behrend, from these interviews, are placed each year in high-paying, responsible jobs.

The Drafting and Design curriculum is intended to prepare detail or layout draftsmen and junior designers for manufacturing industries as well as for the many concerns engaged in installation or erection work. The principal objective of the curriculum is to prepare young men and women for employment in machine design, tool
