active interest in their outside activities. Many an evening will find Mrs. Burnett attending a campus dance or watching her girls rehearse for the various activities in which they participate during the year.

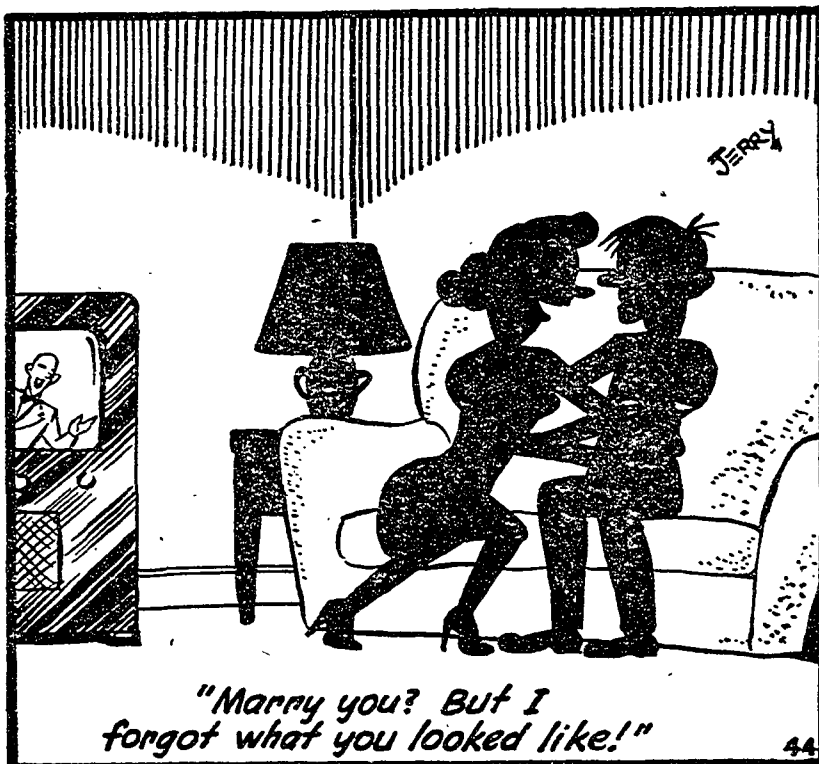
If one of the girls should happen to be late coming back from a week-end trip or a dance, she will always find her housemother waiting up to welcome her home, and lock her safely in.
