

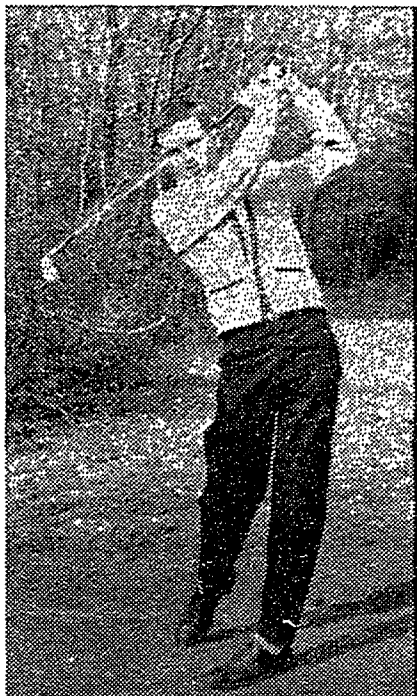
## Sir Gawain Of The Green
