SOCCER

On Wednesday, October 20, the Behrend Soccer Team played Grove City Freshmen on our home field. The final score was 5-1 as Grove City's experience proved too much for the young cubs. Behrend's lone goal was scored midway in the fourth quarter, as Tom Loesh topped in a loose ball in front of the goal.

Grove City completely dominated the first half of play as they scored two goals in each of the first two quarters. In the second half Behrend held Grove City to only one goal.
