## DORM NEWS

Plans for a new dormitory to be constructed at Behrend Campus were submitted last week at University Park to appropriate officials for recommendations and approval. Brennan a nd Brennan, Eric architechtural firm, submitted the plans which, after going through proper channels, should receive final approval by the Board of Trustees in January. Groundbreaking for the new building, which will be situated on the hill by the gravel parking lot, is scheduled for late spring.

The new dormitory will house 100 men and 100 women. Space for a TV room, project rooms, and conference rooms have been incorporated in the plans for the two story structure, A large lounge with a balcony overhead, from which Wesleyville and Lake Erie will be visible, will separate the two wings of the building.

Plans for a dining area to serve the dormitory students and a new library and study and learning center will be worked on this winter.
