ACCREDITATION EXTENDED

The University recently announced that accreditation has been extended at twelve commonwealth campuses, including Behrend, to the two-year Drafting and Design Technology programs by the Engineers' Council for Professional Development. It has also accredited the Electrical and Electronics Technology programs at Behrend and ten other commonwealth campuses, and the surveying technology program at the Wilkes-Barre Center. The associate degree programs in engineering technology have received accreditation for a period of two years extending to September 30, 1967. The D.D.T. and E.E.T. programs are the only ones of their kind in the state to be accredited by the council.
