The first S.G.A. meeting of the term will be held Tuesday, January 10, during the Common Hour. All members are urged to come prepared with new ideas for the winter term.

The President's Board, comprising all organization presidents and editors, will meet at noon on Wednesday, January 11, in the Memorial Room. It is imperative that all members be present.
