SCHOLARSHIP WINNER ANNOUNCED

For the second straight year a Penn State football player has been cited by the National Collegiate Athletic Association for scholastic excellence.

John Runnells, a senior linebacker from Scotch Plains, N.J., has been awarded a \$1,000 NCAA scholarship for postgraduate study at the University or graduate school of his choice.

Runnells is one of 22 College players honored for their scholastic achievement, 11 from the NCAA's university division and 11 from the college division.

The awards were made through the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Awards Committee, headed by Lawrence C. Woodruff, dean of students at the University of Kansas.

A pre-law student majoring in business logistics, Runnells has a career average of 3.48 and during the past football season registered a 3.33. He has been named to the Dean's list four times, including two fall terms when he was busy with football, and twice he compiled perfect 4.0 averages. He plans to enter law school next September.

A regular linebacker for three seasons, Runnells was named to the 1966 All-East second team, the All-Pennsylvania first team and received All-America honorable mention. He was named to a first-team defensive berth on the 1965 Academic All-America team and is a likely repeater on this year's team.
