The president's board meets each week to co-ordinate activities on campus, and to see that several events don't take place at the same time. They now are working on the Winter Weekend project which will include all students and organizations, and take place February 11-13.

The Faculty Evaluation which was circulated during registration was a form drawn up by S.G.A. They worked in shifts to see that students filled it out, and now they are spending an enormous number of hours tallying it up for the benefit of the faculty.
