The fifth annual Undergraduate Student Government Model United Nations will be held February 16-19 at University Park. Delegates to this mock U.N. will include students from University Park and the Commonwealth Campuses. Behrend's delegation includes Marcia Barton, Janis Puzar, and Ron Bachelor.

The issues to be discussed in the General Assembly will include the admission of Red China and the Rhodesian question. In the Security Council an artificial crisis concerning Viet Nam will be discussed.

At the initial meeting of the General Assembly on Thursday, Feb. 16, a representative from the United Nations will deliver the keynote address. On Friday and Saturday, committees of the General Assembly and Security Council will meet. The program concludes Sunday, February 19 with the final meeting of the General Assembly.

BLOOD TYPING SOON
