CUB WIN TWO

Behrend continued on its winning way with victories over DuBois (82-77) last Saturday, and Jamestown Community College (89-75) on Tuesday.

The last time the Cubs played in DuBois they set a record of 137 points scored. This time it was a different story. The first half was comparatively conservative (compared to the second half) with DuBois trailing by only ten points at the half. The last period was a different story with DuBois outshooting Behrend, 47 to 42, led by Larry Nelson of DuBois with 27 points. At one time late in the game DuBois trailed by only one point but, the Cubs managed on and pulled out a 82-77 victory.

High for Behrend were Doug Moorhead with 25, and Dan Fry with 22. Game high honors went to Larry Nelson of DuBois with 47 points.

Tuesday night the Cubs hosted Jamestown Community College. The name of the game was ball control, and Behrend played it to perfection. Control of both the offensive and defensive boards combined with an overpowering fast-break enabled the Cubs to coast to an easy 89-75 win. High scorers for the game were again Doug Moorhead and Dan Fry, with 29 and 24 points respectively.
