SUMMER ART FESTIVAL

Behrend will host the first annual Erie Summer Festival of the Arts as the final program in the Salute to the Arts series. The week-long program will include concerts, performances, exhibitions and workshops. Participating are the Erie Philharmonic, Erie Art Center, Erie Ballet Company and the Erie Civic Theatre.

Appearing will be pianist Gary Graffman, who is described by the French paper Le Figaro as a "phenomenal pianist". Graffman is the only artist to record with all of America's six leading orchestras and it is most appropriate that he should open the program.

Also on the program will be a dedication to the ballet, which will feature many outstanding dancers. The most notable is Violette Vordy, a leading performer with the New York City Ballet.

In the dramatic arts category are Lory Marsh, the leading lady of TV's SECRET STORM, and Alexander Scourby, a notable Broadway actor and performer for the Erie Civic Theatre.

A workshop in advanced sculpture will be conducted by Dr. Selma Burke, head of the Art Department at Salsbury School in New Hope, Pa. The Art Center will also sponsor "Exhibition 1968", a competitive art show.
