BASEBALL: TOURNEY CANCELLED, CUBS LOSE 3

Friday and Saturday, May 17 and 18, Behrend was scheduled to compete in the PJCAA State Tournament at Altoona. The attending teams were Fred Fork, Johnstown, DuBois, Altoona, Robert Morris, Meyers, and Behrend. Because of heavy rains the tourney was forced to be postponed; it was re-scheduled for the 14th and 15th. Behrend had planned to attend and cancel its game with DuBois, however, because of the difficulty of changing schedules for all seven teams the cancellation of the tourney resulted.

The following Tuesday, May 21, the Cubs played its next game with Jamestown Community College at Jameson. Jamestown won the game 6-4. The statistics were comparatively similar but the loss was due to mental errors and the "breaks" that have been plaguing the team all season. This is verified by the fact that 8 of the 9 starters hit safely in the game.

Following this, the next setback for the Cubs came at DuBois on Saturday, May 25. The team dropped a pair of games in a double-header, 4-0 and 6-3. These losses set the Cubs record for the season at 2-8. It should be noted that for the last few games Behrend was without some of its key players.

To conclude its schedule for the year the Cubs will travel to Altoona, Saturday, June 1, for its final double-header. The starting time for the games is 10:00 a.m.

TENNIS BRIEFS
