

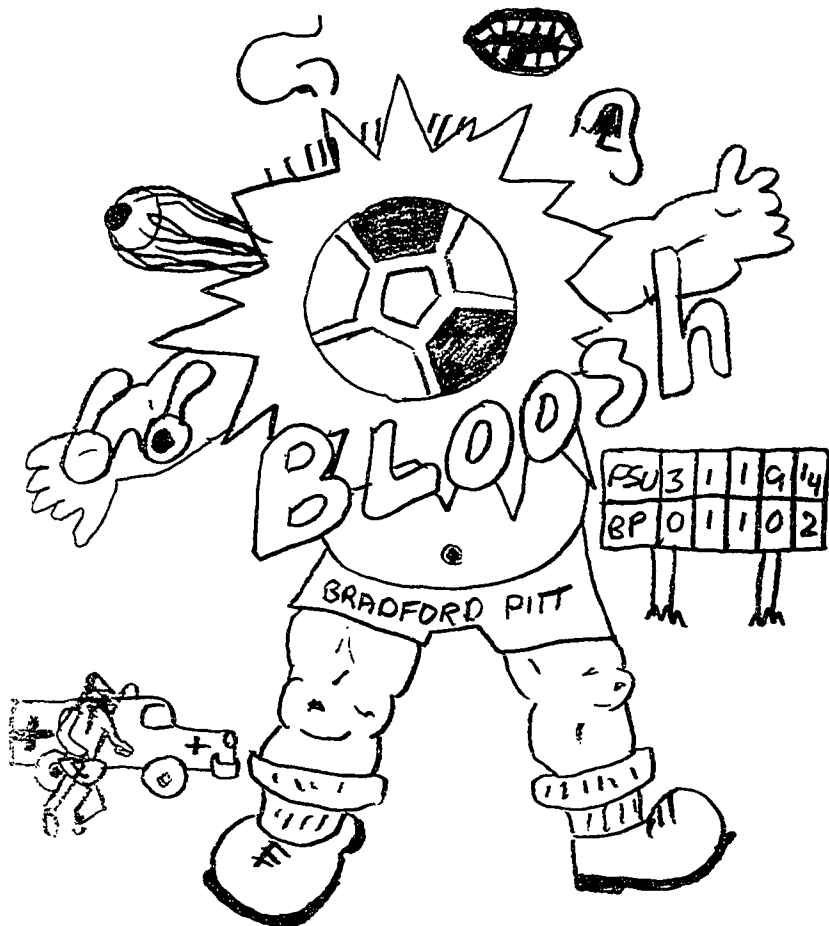

LIONS-BRUINS VIE SATURDAY in L.A.

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA. OCT. 11, 1968 Penn State and UCLA tangle for the sixth and last time Saturday at Los Angeles' 92,000-seat Coliseum, in a series that has seen all but one game decided by a touchdown or less.

Game time for the regionally televised (ABC-TV) contest will be 1:30 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time (4:30 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time).

Penn State, which has won only one of the five meetings between the two sectional powers, should go into the game in its best physical shape since its opener against Navy September 21. Only halfback Bob Campbell and defensive end Lincoln Lippincott are now reported to be out indefinitely by Nittany Lion coach Joe Paterno. Fullback Don Abbey, who sustained knee and ankle sprains in the Navy game, is listed as doubtful.

Penn State, ranked third in the country, rallied in the last half for the second straight time Saturday to defeat West Virginia, 31-20. The Lions came back from a 7-9 deficit a week ago to get past Kansas State, 25-9, after winning its Navy opener, 31-6.

UCLA, ranked fifth on one poll going into last Saturday's game, walloped Pittsburgh in its opener, 63-7, and defeated Washington State, 31-21. However, the Bruins found tougher going at Syracuse in a muddy Archbold Stadium, and now rank 2nd.

Four of the five games played thus far in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less. Penn State won the opener in 1963, 17-14, but it has been all UCLA since. The Bruins have won by scores of 21-14, 24-22 and 17-15, besides the 49-11 walloping they handed out in 1966 in the Coliseum.

This will be the last game in the current contract between the two schools. As a matter of fact, this will be Penn State's last game with a West Coast team for at least the next 10 years.
