NAACP Youth Council Protests School Board Action

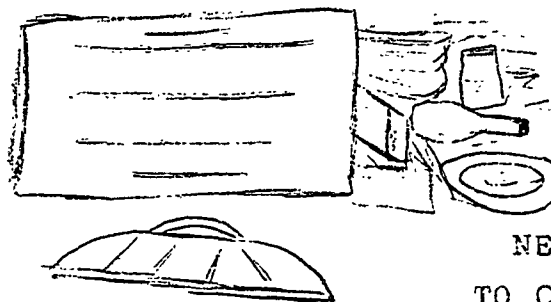
A meeting between the Youth Council of the NAACP and the Erie School Board took place on October 25 after the Youth Council's protest of the Crisis Class currently in operation by the Board.

The Council, composed of college students and delegates from the entire state, was hosted by the Erie delegation along with the NAACP convention. Their protest parade in front of the Erie Public Library where the board was in session, was climatic to the Council's efforts in appraisal of Pennsylvania school system.

Some of the observations during the Youth Council's convention met their approval, such as the Catholic school systems' establishing Afro-American Culture courses.

Through interviews with the President of the Youth Council; several delegates, and their District Director, Richard James; the CUB was told that the operation of a crisis class by the school board did not meet their standard of action toward bettering black-white relations.
