**Delegates Approve Housing Report**

Much discussion at the regional centered around the OSGA's recent report on housing and orientation program for transfer students to University Park. The new program would separate them from the freshmen and give them a different convocation.

The program also reported changes in off-campus housing regulations. The new regulations state that all male students except freshmen may live off-campus wherever they please, while coeds must be in by December 31, 1969 to do so next year.

This report has been approved by all branch campuses except Altoona.
