

ALTOONA BEGINS \$5.6 MILLION CONSTRUCTION

The Board of Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University has approved architectural plans for a \$250,000 All-Faith Chapel at the University's Altoona Campus.

The chapel, which has been financed by private contributions in the Blair County area, will be the first such building to be constructed at any of the University's 19 Commonwealth Campus Locations.

The new religious center is but one phase of the comprehensive \$5.6 million construction program underway at Altoona.

Ground was broken last month for construction of a \$880,000 library--learning center and a \$580,000 science building, both to be financed by a combination of state and federal funds.

Construction has also started on a \$1.1 million residence hall to accommodate 208 students and a \$713,000 food service building as well as a \$784,000 science addition.

The project completion date for all three buildings is June, 1970.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

The change is due, in a large part, to the Organization of Student Government Association's Committee on Housing and Orientation.

Under the new rulings, all male transfer students, except freshmen and all coeds 21 or older by Dec. 31 will be permitted to live off campus.
