

Folk Singer at Villa

Jaime Brockett, a rising young folk singer from Worcester, Mass., will perform at the Villa Maria College, tonight, as a feature of Spring Weekend. He has been honored recently as the best male performer, the best new performer, the second best instrumentalist, and one of the three best songwriters, -in the sixth annual poll results of the Boston Folk.

Jaime will entertain his audience in one night by performing traditional and contemporary music, and if the spirit moves him even ragtime and city blues singing. He is a master of satirical humor, and can as well play a six and twelve-string guitar, a five-string banjo, an autoharp, and a dulcimer.

Brockett has appeared at numerous universities and colleges and major coffee houses in the country. He will perform at the Villa Maria College Auditorium on Friday, May 2, 1969, from 8:30 to 11:30 P. M., sponsored by the Sophomore Class. Tickets will be on sale at the door or at any of the area colleges at \$1.50 each or \$2.75 a couple.
