would drive most people up the wall (I've never even been able to sit through the full half hour of the Dating Game) but if it was done tastefully the meeting of both mediums would be quite felicitous.
I want everyone to think back now, to the old Hit Parade show, then to Shindig, then to Hulabaloo, try to remember any excitement. Hit Parade was a drag, Shindig came close to being the real thing though, I remember seeing a live hour of it in July of '65 that had the Rolling Stones (Mick sneering his way through King Bee and We got a Good

Thing Going was magnificent) Sonny and Cher, doing the incomparable Baby Don't Go, Donovan doing Universal Soldier, The Righteous Brothers doing You've Lost That Loving Feeling, and a faggoty Philadelphia kid named Joey Pake who deserves the obscurity he has. The high point of the show though, was when dirty old PJ Proby came snaking out like the then straight Jim Morrison does now, curling his lip back and spitting out Blue Suede Shoes. The camera explored him from every angle, creating a montage like effect.
Unfortunately, that was an exceptional show, and not the general Shindig presentation. Hulabaloo was lost in its hippier-than-thou attitude, an dI could never stand the mannequin-like chicks that stood around the sets supposedly to give it "Class", besides have fakes like George Hamilton, Roger Smith, Barry McGuire and Sammy Davis as guest hosts added nothing.
A few years ago there was an hour special called Pependipity,

CBS used it to fill in a Friday night spot, it had Flip Wilson and Noel Harrison as hosts, it also had the Buffalo Springfield doing the DAMNDEST and HARDEST versions of Mr. Soul and Bluebird that I've seen, and it was all live! Aretha Franklin and Smokey Robinson did some duets, and the cameras just moved back and dug it, no frills, no hypes, just the music.

This brings me to ABC TV's new Music Scene, which, thank God, is going off the air (as most ABC shows do). Besides not keeping promises (the show of the 17th was supposed to have had Joe Cocker and John Mayall on, I rushed to get home and see them, turned the set on, and was treated to the Cowsills, R. B. Greaves, and Paul Anka, joy). Music scene falls victim to all the things the other music series have, it tries too hard to be hip, it tries to please everybody (the "easy listening" acts usually) and it's a typical ABC "Hey kids, this is where it's AT!!!" shuck.

What keeps my faith in rock on TV?

Once Dick Cavett had a show, where the Airplane, Joni Mitchell, Dave Crosby and Steve Stills came on, and literally kicked out the jams. The Airplane sang a ditty with the lineup against the wall mother—ers and it wasn't blipped! On ABC yet!

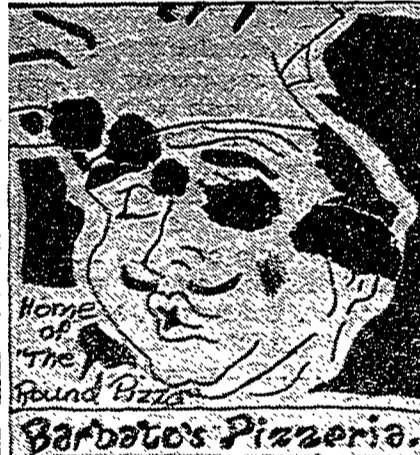

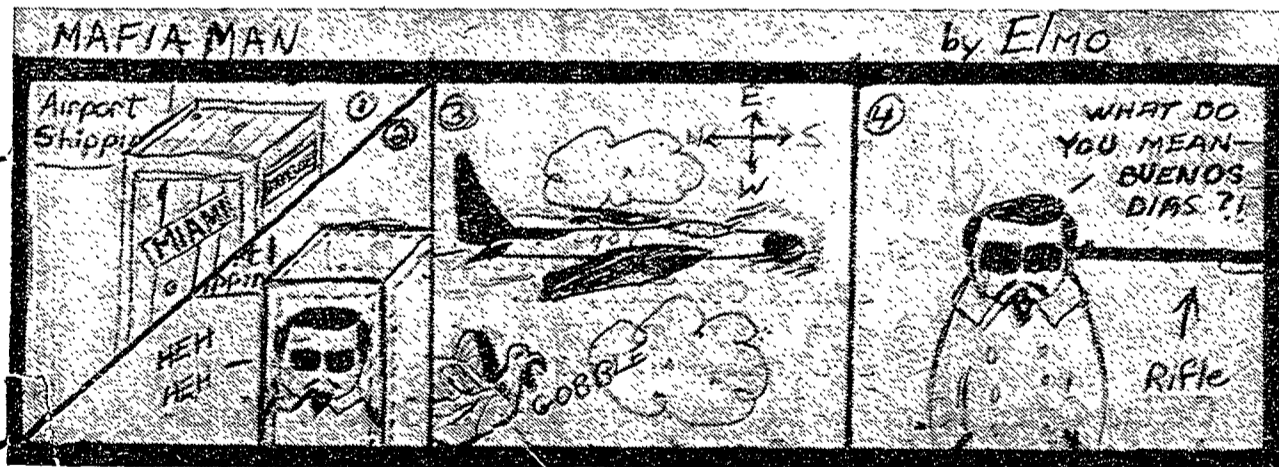
