## LION NOTES

There are no tickets available for the Orange Bowl game between Penn State and Missouri. Penn State sold out of its allotted 12,500 tickets Monday morning.

There will be no tickets available in Miami.

Charlie Pittman, who has set three Penn State records already, is very close to another. He needs four points to top Pete Mauth's (1909-1912) career scoring record of 171 points.

Charlie has 168 points on 28 career touchdowns (a school record). He also holds the mark for the most TDs (14) in one season and his 432 career rushing attempts is a Penn State record.

Penn State safety Neal Smith set a single season interception record last Saturday at Pitt with his ninth theft of the year and increased his Lion career record to 18.

If Penn State can hold N.C. State to 22 points or less it will establish a new school record for lowest number of points allowed in a 10-game season. The mark of 102 was set in 1962. The 1911 Lions held nine opponents to 15 points.

The four teams with the most points scored happen to be the four division leaders . . . Minnesota has scored 319 points to go with their 9-1 record . . . Dallas is 8-2, while scoring 288 points . . . Los Angeles, 10-0, closely follows with 276 . . . Cleveland is 7-2-1, with 262 points scored . . . Fifth place drops 36 points to Baltimore's 226 . . . Defensively, one division almost controls the league . . . Central Division members Minnesota, Detroit, and Green

Bay are 1, 2, 3, allowing 103, 141, and 160 points, respectively . . . Los Angeles is fourth with 169, closely followed by Dallas, 172 . . . Baltimore shows 218 for sixth place . . . In the AL, Kansas City is second in points scored with 300, and have given up only 138 . . . Oakland leads the offense with 303 points . . . Defensively, Houston shows 201 points given up for second best . . . Kansas City hosted Oakland and the Raiders won 27-24 with 2 interceptions run

back for TD's by Dan Conners and George Atkinson . . . The Raider defense picked off 5 K.C. passes in all . . . Oakland is 9-1-1 and the Chiefs, 9-2 . . . The same two teams meet December 13 in Oakland . . . Jim Turner kicked field goals of 29, 41, 50, and 17 yards, leading the Jets to a 40-7 conquest of Cincinnati . . . The Bengals gained 158 yards on 9 first downs for the game . . . Houston also limited a team to 9 first downs, Miami, as they crushed the Dolphins, 32-7 . . . The Dolphins struggled 170 yards . . . The victory virtually clinched second place for the Oilers (5-4-2) . . . The headliner of the NFL was the Dallas-Los Angeles game . . . Each team scored something in each quarter as Dallas' last minute rally fell short and they lost to the Rams 24-23 . . . Dallas gained one more first down and 40 more yards, but lost a fumble and allowed three of their passes to be intercepted . . . Fran Tarkenton had a fine day, but the New York Giant defense didn't, leading them to a 28-17 loss to the Browns . . .

## PSU SPORTS NEWS

University Park, Pa., Nov. 26—Villanova, led by two members of the West German Olympic team and two NCAA All-Americans, is a leading contender to capture the first annual Penn State swimming and diving relay championship.

The meet will be held Saturday at the University Natatorium. The nine-team field also includes Maryland, which along with Villanova shares the favorite's role; East Carolina, West Virginia, La Salle, Bucknell, Bethany and West Penn State.

Tom Aretz, who will swim the breast fly relay and the 800 freestyle for Villanova and Olaf von Schilling, who will compete in the 800 freestyle, are the Wildcats' West German Olympians.

Frank Hartye and John Fitzgerald, the other two members of the 800 freestyle team, are NCAA All-Americans.

Top Maryland participants include breaststroker Barry Accornero of Bethlehem, Pa., co-captain Mike Golub (crawl), Gary Goodner (crawl) and Paul McDonald (fly).

Bethany College comes into the relays with an impressive record in small college competition. It has won three straight swimming and diving titles in the Presidents Athletic Conference and finished seventh in the finals of the NAIA meet last year.

Bethany is led by three-time NAIA All-American Jim Veres (freestyle and butterfly), who holds six individual school records and five Presidents Conference marks.

Don Strunk, who set the Middle Atlantic Conference 200 freestyle (1:45.3) and 100 freestyle (47.2) records, is one of LaSalle's top performers.

Penn State, coached by meet director Lou MacNeill, is paced by captain Gus Achey (breaststroke), Eric Mehnert (freestyle) and divers Steve Miller and Jim Livingston.
