In response to questions, Finley stated that if the students submit a list of records that they wish to have put on the juke box, he'll give it to the vendor who changes records every other Friday. Albums are also going to be put on the juke box, Finley commented further. Still in reference to the cafeteria, Finley assured everyone that a dollar-bill change-

er is a basic requirement in the bidding for the vending concession next fall.

Mail service on Saturdays may be forthcoming, if a cooperative system of sharing the expense that would be incurred can be worked out between Food & Housing and Building & Grounds. Also, soon persons may be able to pick up packages for others by signing their name as well as the addressee's name. Finley will also look into the possibility of the Post Office placing a mailbox on campus and picking up the mail more often than the present once a day.

We ask that the faculty grant amnesty from quizzes and tests during the strike.

After gaining the consensus of the study body opinion, the S.G.A. unanimously passed the resolution by a vote of 20 to 0.

Roy Kirkley, Student Body President, stated the importance of the real issue being understood. Despite the popularity of the three instructors, the action taken by SGA reflect dissatisfaction with present University policies con-

cerning the student body. The issue is not just the dismissal of the "Behrend 20" but the potential of the university to finance any instructor without explanation. Commenting on the SGA action, Kirkley said, "We're taking our first step. We might be squashed but if we are ever to accomplish anything we must start now. We hope the administration won't force us into this boycott but our decision has been made, and if they do we will abide by it."

WRC Members At Conference

Representatives of the Behrend Campus Women's Residence Council and their advisor, Dean Betty Seanor, will attend a conference at Mont Alto on Friday and Saturday, May 1 and 2.

The purpose of the conference, which will be attended by women from several members from Beaver, Edinboro, Mont Alto and Berks Colleges, is to exchange ideas on the activities and government of the Women's Residence Councils.

Roxanne Bobak and Vickie Pledger, co-chairmen for the event, announced that there will be an informal meeting for women present on Friday evening. The possibility of a state-wide government for women residences will be discussed.

On Saturday a more formal meeting will be held with the Mont Alto officers presiding. There will be an exchange of ideas on fund raising government structures, the women's role in the total resident government system, and dormitory facilities and regulations.

The Behrend group will leave here on Friday afternoon, May 1, and return on Sunday.

Norval Reece, Democratic candidate for U. S. Senator, has called for a withdrawal of all troops from Vietnam by the end of 1970.

The Veterans for Race has been organized in Erie because it is felt that veterans of all services, especially those serving in Vietnam and other wars have a right and obligation to inform the citizens of the evils of war and the costs of such a commitment.

His opponent in the May 19th Primary Elections is Democratic Party choice, William Secor of Erie.

Book Review: Indepth Study Of University Riots

Have you ever wanted to know what makes a riot different from a demonstration? Or why a riot starts at a university, and how it develops? Then reading Campus Power Struggle is necessary.

It is an in-depth study of riots at five major universities, (Berkeley, Columbia, Cornell, San Diego, and St. Louis) and the U. of Illinois. The reasons why the riots happened did or didn't do what they did is explained as well as the cause and effects of the riots.

Beyond the mere riots themselves, the book delves into campus problems which can influence or lead to riots—such as problems of drugs, sex, double-jeopardy psychiatrists, and racism. A new, quite bold plan for removing the drug problem is explained. The apathy of some minority groups towards their own suffering is described. And, for the first time in this type of book, an analysis of conservatism among students is done. Their goals, their reasons for being conservative and their ideals and goals are shown.

The last chapter of the book deals with a society now in existence where the students run the government, and control most of the power in the country. It is a study of a country where a student revolution really worked, and what the students are doing with the country now that they have it.

A book of this kind comes along only once in a long while, and it is a must on the reading list of any college student.

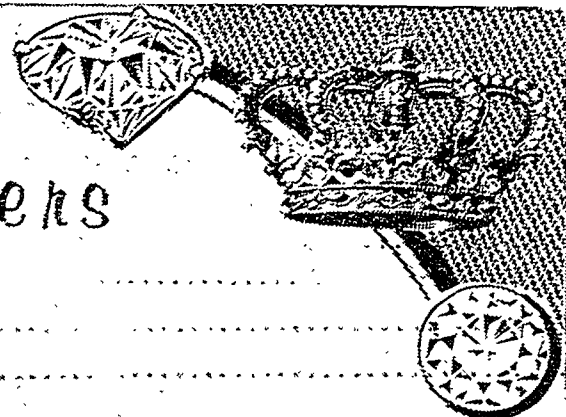
