

"I'm not saying that everybody wrestled up to their full capabilities," Koll notes, "but we had a good effort from everybody."

The good effort resulted in three pins, a couple of upsets and a 9 - 0 - 1 record going into the final dual meet of the season at Pitt on Saturday (February 27). The Lions are undefeated in their last 24 dual meets.
