Borowy Leads Team To Behrend Finish

Gary Borowy, leading Behrend consistently in scoring throughout the year, smashed the Behrend career scoring mark with a total of 988 points. Borowy's record performance topped Doug Zimmerman who tallied 922 points (1968-1970).

Borowy also led the team in rebounds (250), foul shots (97), and points per game (23.1). Glenn McKinney entered his name in the record books by sinking 16 foul shots in one game, tying the old mark of Doug Zimmerman ('69 season).

When asked about the past season Coach Malkin commented, "I can't be too pleased finishing under 500, but the calibre of teams we play are improving greatly.

We were too erratic all season long and we just couldn't put it all together. Compared to last year, we couldn't get mentally prepared for each game. It's tough to maintain that peak, but we simply never reached it. Individually, Borowy is to be

congratulated for his fine performance. Ron Kwasneski, Dan Porath, and Chuck Donnell also turned in fine jobs. And you couldn't ask more from our two freshmen starters Ike Burnett and Glenn McKinney. These two started off slow but after gaining confidence they put on quite a performance.

PSU To Host Gymnastics Championship

The Third Annual Women's National Inter-collegiate Gymnastics Championship will be held at Penn State April 9 and 10.

The competition is sponsored by the Division for Girl's and Women's Sports, the national governing body for women's intercollegiate athletics.

Two preliminary sessions will be held at 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. Friday, April 9, in the North Gymnasium of White Building, Penn State women's physical education building.

The finals will be held in Recreation Building Saturday, April 10, at 2 p.m. Tickets for the final competition are \$1.50 each.

The women will compete in the four international events - floor exercise, vaulting, balance beam, and uneven parallel bars.

Team and individual champions will be selected. The team championship will be determined by the total number of points scored by the highest three out of four contestants representing their team.

Competitors must qualify through regional meets to be eligible for the national championships.

The top 10 finishers in each of the four events in the regional competition are eligible for the national meet.

Roundballers Finish Season

"This season has been one of my longest," says Penn State basketball coach John Bach. "I've lost 15 pounds and gained some gray hair."

The Nittany Lions close their season against Rutgers in New Brunswick, N.Y., Saturday (March 6) at 8 p.m.

Bach is a little grayer and a little lighter after Tuesday's 86-85 overtime loss at Kent State.

The loss dropped the Lions' season record to 10-11 and kept Bach from getting his 300th coaching victory. The Lion coach now has a 21-year record of 299 wins and 225 losses, including a 36-31 record in three seasons at Penn State.

Penn State faces Rutgers next and in addition Penn State has had very little success on the road this season. The Lions are 2-8 on the opposition's court and 8-3 at home.

Bach probably will go with the same lineup he has used the last six games. That alignment has Chuck Crist and Bill Kunze at the forwards, Paul Neumayer at center and Ron Kodish and Bruce Mello at guard.

Kunze is the team's leading scorer, averaging 16.2 points per game. The Lions have balanced scoring from Mello (12.0), Crist (10.0), Neumayer (9.7), and Kodish.

Bach went to sophomore Dan Tarr when Crist got into early foul trouble at Kent State. Tarr responded with a 14 point effort.

If Tarr plays, he will be up against former high school teammate Gene Armstead. A 6-8 center, Armstead is generally considered the main difference


between last year's 13-11 Rutgers team and this year's 15-7 squad.

An excellent defensive center, Armstead leads the team in rebounds and is averaging 16 points per game.

Steve Kaplan, a 6-6 forward, is the leading scorer for Rutgers, averaging 18.2 points per contest. Guards Bob Wenzel (14.8) and John McCadden (8.0) and forward Tom Roth (8.8) round out the Rutgers lineup.

Penn State stopped Rutgers 65-62 last year to take a 22-12 lead in a series that started in 1922.
