

# Teacher Award Planned

The Behrend Campus Advisory Board Excellence in Teaching Award is to be given at the Graduation Exercises this June. It will be awarded to the faculty member who in the opinion of students and colleagues most truly fills the role of an inspired and committed teacher.

Any faculty member who has completed two or more years of continuous full-time undergraduate teaching service is eligible.

Any member of the Student Government Association, faculty, or administration as well as any officially chartered student organization of Behrend Campus may sponsor a nominee for the award.

Each sponsor must complete a set of nomination papers. These are available from the Office for Academic Affairs. All nominations must be returned to the Office for Academic Affairs by June 1.

Selection of the recipient will be by a committee consisting of three students and three ineligible faculty members. Last year's recipient is automatically included in this group. The Assistant Director for Academic Affairs will name the Selection Committee and serve as an ex officio member.

The ceremony of choice, and the tapping of new members into Cwens, a national honor society for sophomore women on campus, was received by 21 members of the present freshman class.

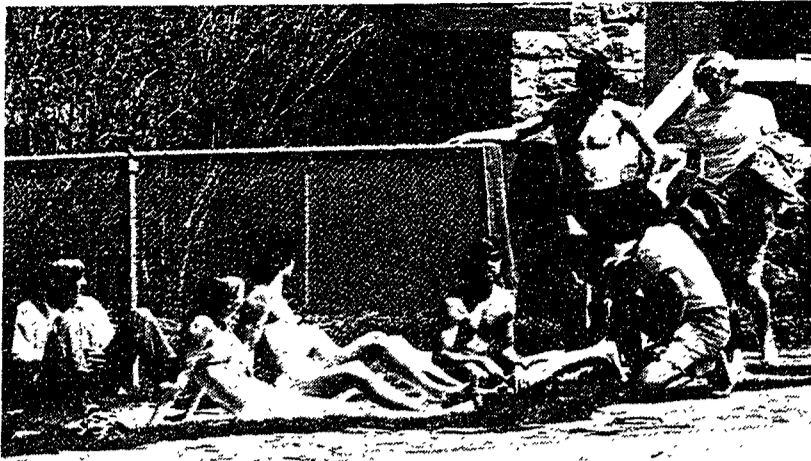

Bill Puka, talented song writer and musician, is going places in the music world. But before he does, Puka will appear before Behrend audiences on May 13 at 9 to 11 p.m. and May 14 and 15 from 10 to 1 P.M. in the RUB dining hall.

Puka's musical career began recently when he recorded his own songs on a Columbia record entitled Bill Puka. His works show jazz influences musically and heavy Southern influences lyrically. They describe feeling and emotions which all of us have had, but which very few of us could say out loud. Puka describes his own work as bordering on "earthy!"

Before Columbia happened to him, Puka earned several degrees at Hofstra, Rutgers, and Brown Universities. He was awarded a teaching fellowship at Harvard, where he instructed philosophy while continuing his own studies in philosophy and psychotherapy. He is presently finishing his thesis paper for graduate school and plans to continue teaching.

Puka began writing songs to accompany his own puppet show at Brown through which he supported himself at grad school. Gradually his songs became more personal expressions of his own emotional experiences. Puka plans to follow up his first cut

with at least 2 more recordings. Right now, Puka is playing the Coffee House Circuit at Behrend on May 13, 14, and 15. Admission is \$.50 or free with Activity Card.

# Summer Jobs Remain Scarce

Are you a graduate having trouble finding a new job? If so, you should see the Pennsylvania Bureau of Employment Security. It is designed to assist new graduates in cracking the "job barrier" by providing pertinent occupational information.

In an annual guide prepared by the Bureau, the outlook for job seekers is considered bleak instead of black. Erie now has 106,100 people at work with 6,100 idle; a year ago this data was 108,200 and 4,000. The growth in the work force is now outpacing job expansion.

On the other hand, there are two points that bear stressing. One, Erie's diversified industrial structure gives this area a distinct economic advantage since it is less affected by broad swings in the business cycle.

Two, attribution—retirements, deaths, and transfers—continually create openings.

As always, the girl or young man who presents a background of training, experience, or a good academic record will be the preferred applicant. However, with competition so keen this year, graduates cannot afford to be choosy.

The professional staff at the Pa. Bureau of Employment Security can assist a graduate in formulating his vocational plans and sharpening jobhunting techniques. It is important to identify and evaluate capabilities at the outset. BES test facilities (aptitude and proficiency); counseling services; and interviewing tips can be most valuable.
