STUDENTS MUST PRE-REGISTER

All students who plan to return to the Center for the Spring Semester-1956- are asked to pre-register before December 12 on the basis of the following schedule:

Third semester students should report the week of November 21

Second semester students should report the week of November 28 on any day except the 28th.

First semester students should report the week of December 5.

The semester referred to above is the one that you are presently enrolled in.

Before reporting to Mr. Noble for pre-registration you should do the following:

Check the college catalogue to see what courses are required in your curriculum.

Arrange a tentative schedule with your advisor.

Then see Mr. Noble for the final step in pre-registering.

A pre-registration form which will explain the procedure of pre-registering for the Spring Semester will be sent to the student's home on Nov 14. A copy of the student's mid-semester grades will accompany the registration form.

GRADES AVAILABLE

Students! Your advisor will have your grade sheet either Wednesday or Thursday the 16th or 17th. A notice will be posted on the bulletin board as to the exact date your grades will be available to you.

Please note: your individual grades can only be obtained through your advisor, but a letter giving your present status in college will be sent to your home.

ACCREDITING THE CENTER

On Thursday, November 3, and Monday, November 7, the Center, as a part of the Pennsylvania State University, was accredited by a three-member committee from the Middle-Atlantic State Association. The work of the three members, consisting of Dr. Levy, Director of evening classes at the City College of New York, Dr. Rodes, President of Bradley College, and Dr. Romanowitz, head of the Electrical Engineering Department of Kentucky University, was to evaluate the operations of the Center. The latter two men were also representing the Engineering Council for the Professional Development which is a representative committee of the American Society for Engineering Education.
