CHORUS PLANS HOLIDAY PROGRAM

CARPER HURT IN ACCIDENT

Capt. Walter Carper was injured at 6:45 a.m., Wednesday, November 23, while traveling to Olmstead Air Force Base at Middletown, Pa. Carper's car went out of control and rolled over when it hit a patch of ice on a mountain near Olmstead Field. The car was completely demolished.

Carper was sent to the hospital where he was treated for a cracked vertebrae and a compressed vertebrae, and also for cuts and contusions. He will be unable to return to the campus for approximately six weeks.

Carper and a friend, Capt. Evans who was enroute to England, were traveling to Olmstead to make a routine flight to Maine, when the accident occurred. Evans was released from the hospital suffering from only slight concussion and a slight cut on the head.

During the absence of Capt. Carper from school, the ROTC Department has sent an officer to Hazleton from the main campus.

There will be no admission charge for either of these concerts. Everyone is invited to attend.
