ATTENTION SPRING TRANSFER STUDENTS

INTRODUCTORY AMERICAN LITERATURE

A three-credit evening course in introductory American Literature, meeting one two-hour session per week, will be offered at The Pennsylvania State University Center, Highacres, Hazleton, beginning Monday evening, October 29, at 7:30, providing enough adults are interested.

The course may meet any evening which the group decides. Also, the program may be held on the Highacres Campus or the Hazleton Public Library, depending on the convenience of the group. The initial meeting, however, will be held at Highacres.

The fee for the three-credit program is \$45. Of this amount \$22.50 is due the first night of classes on October 29. The remainder is due on the sixth class meeting. Checks may be made payable to The Pennsylvania State University.

Texts in inexpensive paper-bound editions will be sold throughout the course in class. Students need not purchase books prior to the beginning of the program.

The instructor of the program will be Professor Andrew Kafka, a full-time member of the Penn State Center in Hazleton.

BOWLING TOURNAMENT
