READING MACHINE AVAILABLE FOR USE BY STUDENTS

A reading machine given by the Class of 1955-56 as its Convocation gift to the Highacres Campus is now available for use by any Highacres student who wishes to improve his reading speed.

This machine which is called a Reading accelerator is an instrument with a moving shutter that travels at a constant speed down the page of reading material. Depending on a students rate of reading, this shutter can be adjusted for different speeds within a wide range of words per minute. It moves smoothly, covering a line at a time and challenging the reader to keep ahead as his eye movements progress down the page. This results in faster reading for the student.

The students here at Highacres are encouraged to usethis machine. An English instructor whether it be Mrs. Bodonstein, Mrs. Ferry, Mr. Vilcox or Ir. Kafka must be present at the time when the student is using the Reading Accelerator. This machine may be found in the office of Mr. Vilcox and Mr. Kafka, Room 103, South Hall. — George Opilla
