

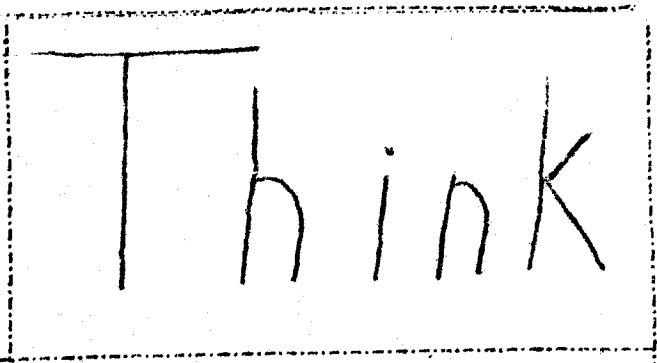
THE CHORUS COMES THRU AGAIN

The College Community Chorus under the direction of Miss Pearl Garbrick, made a very good showing at the first concert of its tenth season. The program, which concerned Christmas, covered a great deal of musical territory. Work by Bach, representing the Baroque school of music, was nicely balanced by a contemporary composition, Alleluia by Rondall Thompson. The classical period of music was very well represented by Hayden's "Toy Symphony." This symphony was one of the highlights of the program. Being a musical joke, it was scored only for strings and toy instruments. Mrs. Charlotte Phillips and Miss Garbrick played excellently in the violin section and were well supported in the bass by Mr. Ward at the cello. The major work of the evening was the "Christmas Oratorio" by Saint - Saens. Particularly interesting in this work was the duet by Mrs. Bigelow and Mr. Leroy Hinkle. The program was closed by two brilliant choruses from Handel's "Messiah." According to tradition, the entire audience stood during the Hallelujah Chorus.

The accompaniment, although a bit rough in places, was generally well done. A bright spot in the accompaniment was "For Unto Us A Child Is Born" from the "Messiah" played in an excellent manner by Miss Kathy Barthalmus.

The evening was closed very pleasantly with refreshments served by the Theta Sigma Pi Sorority. I offer my sincere congratulations to Miss Garbrick for excellent performance.
