

## HIGHACRES BASKETBALL TEAM LOOKS FOR FIRST VICTORY

Playing on their own court, the Highacres team was defeated 67-63 by the Scranton Center. Leading most of the game, the fourth quarter proved to be the downfall for our squad. High scorer for the game was tall Mr. Haikes, who contributed 25 points towards the Scranton victory. Harry Scheidy and Mr. Sterba scored 21 and 20 points, respectively, for the losers.

On February 8, our team was host to Keystone Junior College. Remembering their previous defeat, the boys were out for revenge. But, the final period proved to be disastrous for the "Highacres Five." They lost a heart-breaker by the slim margin of 65-63. Both Jim? Marone and Joe Fulton scored 14 points, and Jim Sterba and Harry Schiedy combined for a total of 26 points.

Applications for the April 28, 1960 administration of the College Qualification Test are now available at Selective Service System local boards throughout the country.

Eligible students who intend to take this test should apply at once to the nearest Selective Service local board for an application and a bulletin of information.

Following instructions in the bulletin, the student should fill out his application and mail it immediately in the envelope provided to SELECTIVE SERVICE EXAMINING SECTION, Educational Testing Service, P. O. Box 558, Princeton, N. J. Applications for the April 28 test must be postmarked no later than midnight, April 7, 1960.

According to Educational Testing Service, which prepares and administers the College Qualification Test for the Selective Service System, it will be
