He has traveled and lectured widely throughout the west and the Orient. From

1946 to 1953, he was Professor of Foreign Missions and Christian International Relations at Boston University and Summer School, Professor of San Diego State College, University of Oregon, and Garrett Biblical Institute.

He returned to India in 1953 to become Professor of Political Science, Nagpur University and was named President of the Indian Political Science Association and the Sectional President of the All-Indian Educational Conferences in 1954. In 1957, he became the University Professor of Political Science at Bihar University and Acting Frincipal (President) of Ranchi College, Ranchi, Bihar, India. He was President of the All-India Conference of Indian Christians, and elected to this office for the fourth year consecutively.

He is the author of three books: <u>Folitical Theory</u>, <u>The Future Constitution</u> <u>of India</u>, and his last, <u>Christianity</u> <u>in the Indian Crucible</u>. He is now working on his next book which will be entitled <u>Social Issues of India</u>.

In the United States, he has lectured extensively under the auspices of the American Friends Service Committee, East and West &ssociation, Foreign Policy Association, American Academy of Social and Political Sciences, and has spoken independently before American colleges, Universities, churches, and fraternal, social and service clubs. He speaks often in India before similar groups. His last visit to America occured from April to June of 1960, chiefly under American Friends Service Committee auspices.
