## Hazleton loses to Scranton 122-104, 2 games left

 Hazleton PSU suffered a disappointing 122-104 loss at the hands of Scranton Friday night, February 12th, at Scranton. Had Hazleton won they would have all but been assured of their division championship, but as it turned out they are in a 2nd place tie with Schuylkill and must hope that Schuylkill can defeat Scranton next week. In that event, all three teams would wind up in a tie and a way playoff would follow.

Hazleton just couldn't get untracked at Scranton and found themselves down by as many as 18 points in the first half. The first half ended with Scranton on top 58-44. Coach Bobby's five came out pressing in the 2nd half and for a while it looked like the strategy would work because Hazleton cut the lead to 69-62 six minutes into the 2nd half. However, that was Hazleton's only impressive moment as Scranton went on to outscore them 31-12 to take a 100-74 lead with less than five minutes remaining.

Scranton's two 6 foot 5 boys wound up with a total of 77 points between them, Ron Kaniel scored 43 and Emil Suchter netting 34. It was definitely Hazleton's worst performance to date, even though they placed five men in double figures.  
 On Monday, Jan. 31, Hazleton traveled to the Blue Mountain High School gym to take on Schuylkill and they came home a 93-88 winner. Hazleton led by as many as 23 points in the 2nd half, but had to hold on against a fierce Schuylkill rally. Jim Chapman,

Hazleton's most consistent performer to date, did it again against Schuylkill with a 32 point performance. Twenty nine of Chapman's points came in the first half, when the whole Hazleton team could manage 44. However, in the 2nd half, Bill Schaller and Larry Kovatch took over and combined for 33 points. Schaller scored all of his 20 points in the 2nd half and Kovatch netted 13 of his game total of 17. Joe Zoeller played his usual fine floor game as he flipped in 14 points and Craig Knouse added 10. Schaller

pulled down 16 rebounds, Kovatch 11, and Zoeller 10.  
 Coach George Bobby's five then entertained Allentown PSU on February 9th at the Jewish Community Center, and looked impressive in a 92-73 victory. Hazleton threatened to break the game open midway through the first half, but Allentown fought back to make it a 41-35 game at halftime, in favor of Hazleton. Allentown, behind the shooting of their fine guard, Ron Hoffman, pulled to within two points at 64-62 with ten

minutes remaining, but Hazleton began to put everything together and won it going away. Bill Schaller was high for Hazleton with 28 points, Jim Chapman had 26, Joe Zoeller 12, Larry Kovatch 10 and Wayne Stewart 8. Schaller once again was the leading rebounder with 12 and Kovatch had 11. Zoeller had 9 assists to lead in that department. Craig Knouse injured his hip early in the game and saw limited action, but he should be ready for Hazleton's next game.

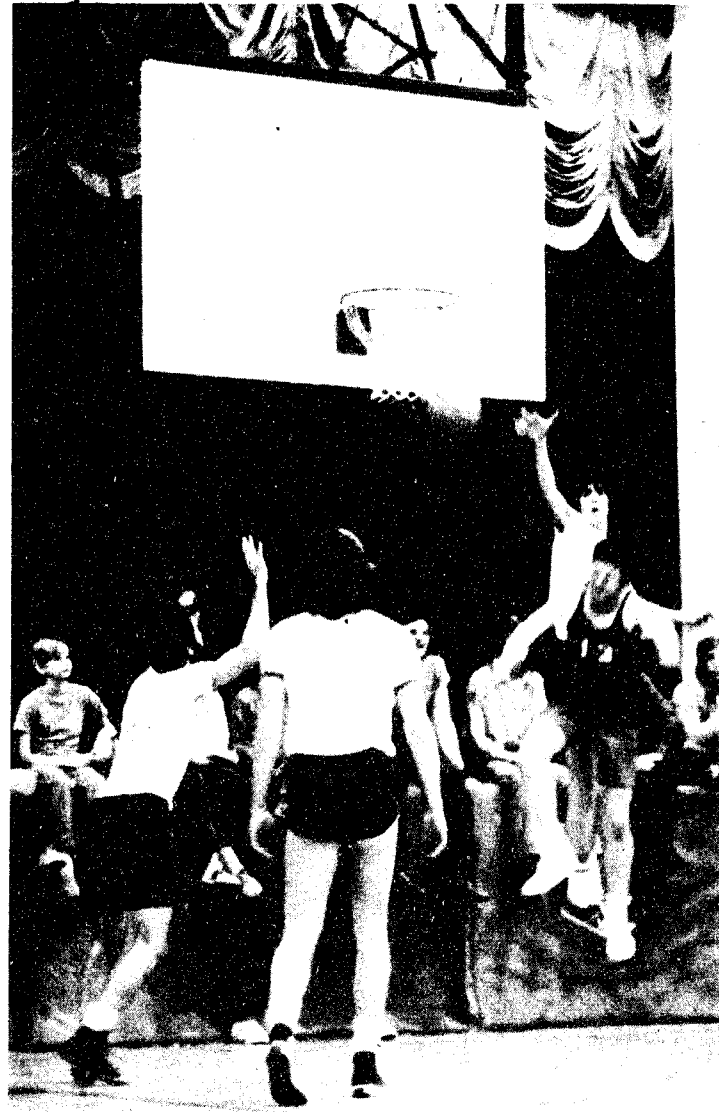

John Tighe coached the students and Bobby was the player-coach for the winning faculty.

A student-faculty volleyball game is planned for spring term. It will take that long for the faculty to recover from their basketball victory.

### "Good grass" petition in California

(EARTH NEWS) The California petition which is seeking to place the decriminalization of marijuana on the November ballot has received the official "OK" from the State's Attorney General's Office.

Members of the California Marijuana Initiative (CMI) organization announced this week that they are now in the process of circulating approved petitions to gather a required 350,000 signatures. The proposed law change simply repeals all state laws which impose criminal penalties on possessors of grass. The sale of marijuana will still be illegal.

A spokesman for CMI said the organization will attempt to gather at least half-a-million signatures, most of them on college campuses, before a July 3rd deadline. California is one of three states which is currently attempting to decriminalize pot with a vote on the November ballot. The other two are Arizona and Washington.
