### Russians at **U** Park

UNIVERSITY PARK (APS) --Twenty-nine years ago,a People's Artist of the USSR named Nadezhda Nadezhdina formed a dance company and called it "Beryozka," Russian for "little birch."

Nadezhdina, the director and creator of all the dances and programs, brought her "little birch" to Recreation Hall on Friday, October 6, and turned in a stunning performance.

Her company of one hundred men and women dancers, singers, and musicians, performed to an almost continuous, and always thunderous applause. The Beryozka Dance Company was the first in a series of five major events planned by the Artists Series of the Pennsylvania State University. The magnificence of the athletic strength displayed by the men was off-set by the beautiful, flowing grace of the women, as theydanced to folk music from the wide-flung corners of the Soviet Union. Customes, choreography, and

music were interwoven into a program of seventeen distinct "stories."

It can safely be said that Nadezhdina is a genius in her field. The incredible intricacy and complexity of her dances is interpreted to absolute perfection by some of the biggest names in Russian dance. Testimony to the perfection displayed was the five-minute standing ovation from the capacity throng at the conclusion of the program.

The Pennsylvania State University Artists Series can feel justifiably proud of their first major program of the year. Forthcoming programs include The Hungarian State Symphony Orchestra on Saturday, November 18, 1972; Van Cliburn, and the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, Saturday, May 12, 1973.
